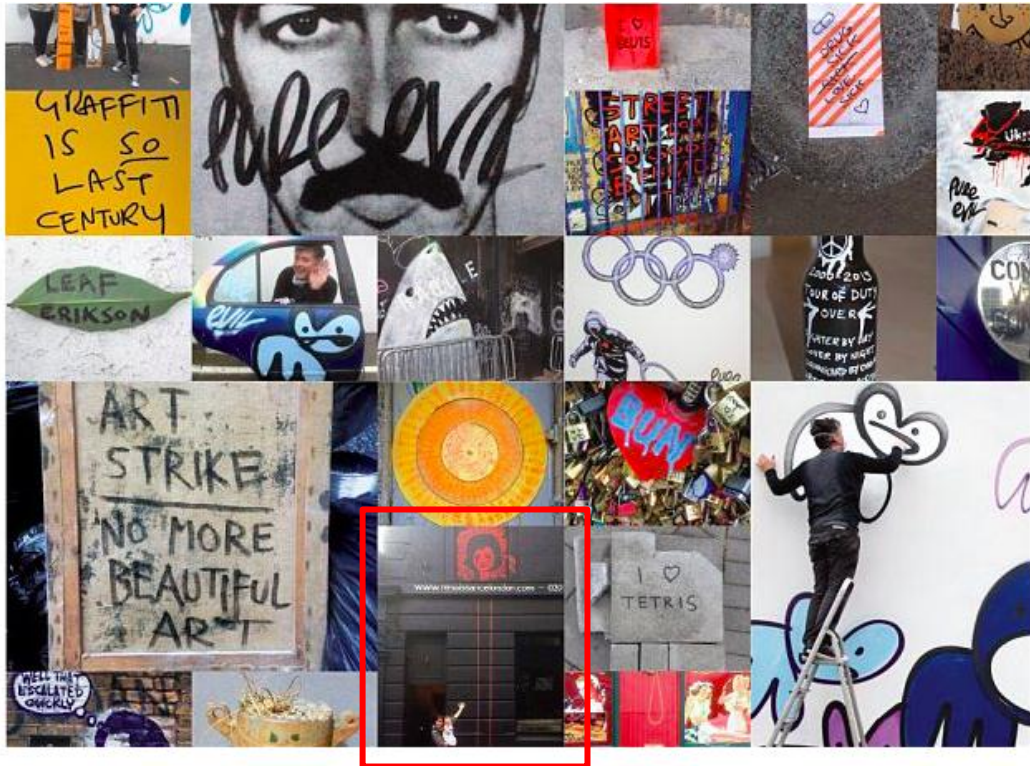


# 365 ways to turn a load of old rubbish into art

If anyone can relate to the phrase, 'one man's trash is another man's treasure,' it's Charles Uzzell-Edwards. The London-based street artist, better known as Pure Evil, is famed for the somewhat unusual materials (a used coffee cup, an aeroplane sick bag) he recycles into guerrilla installations that he then leaves in random places for his fans to find and claim.

Since January, these art drops have become a daily occurrence, as part of a decision he made to paint, stencil or paste at least one work every day for a year, wherever he is, whatever the circumstances.
